ST BENEDICT'S COLLEGE CULTURE PROGRAM

St Benedict's College offers a broad range of co-curricular opportunities to engage students who are interested in Culture. While participation in these experiences is voluntary, students who join a group are expected to make a commitment to rehearsals/meetings and participate fully in the program. There are opportunities for students to go to competitions, festivals and enjoy guest speakers and visiting artists. The co-curricular program is always very popular with a diverse range of students who enjoy working with their teachers and each other in a relaxed and friendly environment.

Opportunities for extension are available in:

Arezzo

Arezzo is a Music Ministry group made up of musicians and singers. The students learn the skills of leading liturgical celebrations. Students will be leading the music for College Mass and other liturgical events.

Bare Feet Drama

Students will learn skills of Drama, extending on class work. Students will participate in Drama Festivals and audition for these. In term 2, rehearsals will be extended until 5.00 pm. As these dates draw nearer, extra rehearsals on Sundays may be needed. Students in this group are also given opportunities to perform at other College events, where confident reading or drama skills are needed.

Benedict's Voices

Benedict's Voices is a choral group that learn to sing in harmony together. Their repertoire includes popular music as well as classical pieces. Students perform for events and festivals as arranged by the Conductor.

Concert Band

Students in Concert Band learn a variety of pieces and enjoy playing together to create a unified sound. Students perform for various events at the College to give them experiences with audiences and to showcase their learning.

Dance Troupe

Dance Troupe is a group for dancers of different levels of experience regardless of age, who challenge themselves to master different steps and routines and increase flexibility. Students may wear their own appropriate comfortable dance gear to rehearsals; however, College approved uniforms are needed for performances. Students have opportunities to perform in eisteddfods and other College events.

Students have the opportunity to complete against other schools in the Queensland Debating Union competition. There is no cost for this activity. Students need to be able to get their own way to and from other schools across Brisbane in the evenings.

Glitterbomb

This is a performance choir group which mixes harmonies with basic choreography. Students learn microphone techniques and have opportunities to perform at events. Students in this group are expected to be comfortable singing solo and have an ability to sing harmonies.

St Benedict's Culture Program: Code of Conduct

Representing St Benedict's College in any event is a privilege. The importance of adhering to a Code of Conduct ensures that performers, coordinators and officials can perform their tasks to the best of their ability, unhindered by inappropriate conduct.

The following Code of Conduct highlights the level of expected behaviour of performers when participating in Culture Program activities at St Benedict's College, whether that be rehearsals or in competition. Consequences for not honouring this Code of Conduct are listed below. Please ensure that you have read and understand this code prior to participating in training and competitions. For further information please contact the Culture Program Leader.

Expectations of members and supporters of St Benedict's College Culture Program Groups

- Exhibit behaviour within the College community **prior** to and **during** representation that signifies a capacity to represent St Benedict's College to an acceptable standard. Students who fail to demonstrate these capacities may be **withdrawn from a College group**.
- College behaviour and commitment to studies will be of an acceptable standard. A student may not be
 permitted to represent the College in extra-curricular activities if this standard is not met. This decision
 could be made at any time leading up to or during an event.
- Students representing St Benedict's College for performances, should notify the Culture Program Leader should they be part of any outside group that may be entering the same competitions and festivals. It is not ideal for a student to be representing the College and an outside agency at the same event and may breach the rules of the competition. Where the rules permit students to represent both their school and an outside body, the Culture Program Leader must still be notified, and priority must be given to the College, unless the outside representation is at a significantly higher level.
- Be on time to all rehearsals and notify the Coordinator if you are unable to make it. Provide a valid explanation for the absence, ideally in the form of a note from a parent/guardian.
- Follow all directions of the activity/group Coordinator(s).
- Show respect for yourself, your fellow group members, officials and their abilities.
- Control your temper no criticism by word or gesture.
- Compete by the competition conditions and rules.
- Exhibit exemplary integrity in the performance arena above everything else.
- Encourage and support your own group members and be respectful to other schools and organising bodies.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your group your group's performance will benefit and so will your own.
- Behave in a manner that respects the rights of others regardless of mediums of communication used e.g. digital mediums such as Social Media, email and texts.
- Always wear the official activity/group uniform, including purchasing items if needed, as directed by the Culture Program Leader and College.
- Stay in the designated activity/group area and support other group members during times when you are not performing.
- Ultimately, take responsibility for your own behaviour and performance.

Student Consequences for Breaches of the Code of Conduct

Coordinators will deal immediately with any breaches of this code by imposing appropriate consequences. Some of these may include:

- Verbal warning to student identifying breaches of the code
- Formal meeting with Coordinator and Culture Program Leader
- Notification to parents/carers
- Removal from the activity/group
- Suspension from all College and representative Culture Program activities, groups and events.

Additional information for Supporters

Please note, all St Benedict's supporters, including family members (not limited to parents/guardians), friends and student supporters are expected to conduct themselves in a manner which reflects the values, beliefs and expectations of St Benedict's College. Identified breaches will be reported to the College Principal and supporters may be banned from attending St Benedict's College Culture Program events.
